We work closely with select Disability Employment Providers to source suitable candidates, mentor them to become job ready for our members, and provide ongoing post-placement support to ensure sustainable and successful employment outcomes.

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# **OPERATIONAL REVIEW**

Dear Members.

This year has been one of growth, recognition As we move into FY2025/2026, we do so and real impact for HDNWA.

I'm incredibly proud of what our small team has achieved, continuing to adapt to industry needs while staying true to our mission of creating meaningful employment for people living with disability.

Sustainable employment remains at the heart of everything we do. Our team has supported members to build inclusive workplaces, match the right candidates to the right roles and provide ongoing support for long-term success.

It's been rewarding to see how these opportunities have transformed lives, fostering purpose, belonging, and independence.

### Highlights from this year include:

- Conducted **166** interviews with candidates. living with disabilities.
- Placed **86** candidates into employment.
- Secured a DSS ILC **Grant extension** to continue promoting inclusive employment across WA.
- Received a **Tourism WA** grant to launch the Passport to Your Career Toolkit.
- Won the CCIWA Small Business Award for leadership in inclusion.
- Were named **finalists** in the AHA (WA) Suppliers awards and NDS Awards for Innovation.
- Wrapped up the Tourism Navigators Pilot to help businesses embed inclusive practices.
- **Strengthened** partnerships with Tourism WA, AHA, schools, and providers.
- **Expanded** our network with more employers championing inclusion across the industry.

### **Looking Ahead**

With the support of our members, partners and funders, HDNWA will continue to champion inclusive employment, expand our reach across regional Western Australia and develop new initiatives that prepare the next generation for careers in tourism and hospitality.

Our achievements this year have only been possible because of the collaboration, trust and shared belief of our community from our board and members to our dedicated team and the incredible individuals we support.

Together, we are redefining what inclusive employment looks like in Western Australia.



### FINANCIAL REPORT

The 2024–25 Financial Statements include four Profit & Loss reports, providing a snapshot of HDNWA's financial position over the 12-month period from July 2024 to June 2025

Comparative figures are presented as "Last Year Actual" to show year-on-year performance.

#### **ILC Grant**

The ILC Grant continues to be HDNWA's primary source of operational funding.

- Funds received to date: \$292,127 (2023), \$228,188 (2024), and \$273,828 (2025).
- Major expenditure: staff salaries and wages, totaling \$358,000 in FY2025.
- Result: a (\$116,668) deficit, reflecting the use of prior-year surplus funds.
   Approximately \$44,000 remains available for use in 2025–26.

### **TLN Grant**

The remaining TLN grant funds (\$15,090) were fully expended in July 2024. The grant has now been completed and formally closed.

### **Sundry Grants**

A new "Sundry Grants" Profit & Loss was introduced during FY2025 to capture smaller projects and training income.

- DDWA Grant: \$1,000 received, with \$905 expended by year end.
- Training Revenue: \$4,000 earned through industry training and presentations.

### **Tourism WA Grant**

During the year, HDNWA was awarded a \$40,000 grant from Tourism WA to support the development of a new youth-focused employment toolkit.

At 30 June 2025, \$39,309 remained unspent. These funds will be carried forward into the next financial year to complete the project's delivery.

### **Financial Summary**

HDNWA remains primarily funded through grants, with modest additional revenue generated through training activity and bank interest.

- Bank Interest: \$27
- Training Income: \$4,000

At 30 June 2025, HDNWA held \$83,500 in cash reserves.

During the year, HDNWA also invested in essential IT and office equipment for staff. These items were expensed and therefore do not appear on the Balance Sheet as capital assets.

### **Subsequent Events**

In June 2025, HDNWA entered into a new agreement with the Department of Social Services, extending the ILC Grant for a further 12 months.

- Additional funding: \$273,828 (FY2026)
- Total ILC funds to date: \$1,067,971
- First instalment of \$164,297 (ex GST) received in July 2025.

In July 2025, HDNWA also received \$250,000 (ex GST) from the Department of Communities to continue advancing inclusive employment initiatives across Western Australia.





# CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

Our engaged Board meets regularly and are responsible for overseeing the operations of HDNWA, as well as a sounding board for the operational team. All volunteers, our board composition includes Hospitality industry professionals who are leading advocates for disability employment in the sector. HDNWA operate in a risk aware environment. Fulfilling this approach involves steering committees being established for project-specific work, which ensures our Managing Director is well-supported in decision-making.

Craig has been the Chairperson of the Hospitality Disability Network WA since July 2021, acting in an advisory role on the board. Appointed to the Board at its inception in 2018, he played a key role in the six months leading up to the launch in May 2019. 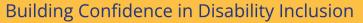

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# **HDNWA REACHES 300 PLACEMENTS**

HDNWA is excited to celebrate a major milestone, reaching 300 placements since our journey began in 2019.

This achievement is made even more special by sharing the story of Hector and his new role at Refresh Juice.

Liam, the owner of Refresh Juice, dreamed of creating a more inclusive workforce but found the disability employment system overwhelming.

That's where HDNWA came in. By taking the time to understand his business and team, we streamlined the process, connected him with the right providers, and supported him in finding the best fit.

That's when Hector came along. Living with vision impairment and facing ongoing health challenges, Hector had been out of work for some time. Determined to get back into the workforce, he was matched with Liam and the Refresh Juice team.

With a few workplace adjustments and plenty of support, Hector has settled into his role and is thriving. Liam shared, "Having Hector on the team has been fantastic. The camaraderie is high, and I hope he stays with us for a long time. He's now part of the Refresh family."

For Hector, this job has been life-changing. He is now able to support his family again and be part of a workplace that values his strengths.

CASE STUDY

This placement is the **145th** under the ILC BEC Grant and marks HDNWA's **300th** overall.

It highlights the power of collaboration and the success of our industry-led model in creating lasting employment opportunities for people with disability, while supporting businesses to become truly inclusive.

# **TURNING OPPORTUNITIES INTO** MEANINGFUL EMPLOYMENT

HDNWA's membership represents a diverse network of employers across Western Australia, spanning the hospitality and tourism sectors.

With 56 active employer members and connections extending to over 200 businesses statewide, our network includes small enterprises, large corporations, and everything in between.

This broad membership base creates meaningful employment opportunities for people with disability, enabling them to build sustainable careers within inclusive workplaces that value diversity.

HDNWA offers a strong value proposition for candidates seeking roles in hospitality and tourism. We take the time to understand each individual's skills, interests, and support needs, ensuring the right match between candidate and employer.

Working in partnership with employment service providers and referrers, we pre-screen candidates, guide them through the recruitment process, and provide post-placement support to help them settle in and succeed.

This is a comprehensive resource designed to support young people living with disability in exploring career opportunities in tourism and hospitality.

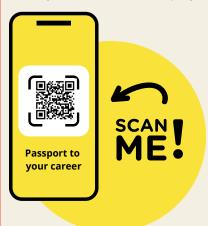

The toolkit includes step-by-step guidance on different roles, tips for applying for positions and real-world examples of career pathways.

By providing this resource, HDNWA continues to promote inclusive employment practices and expand opportunities for people living with disability across Western Australia.

Since its launch, the toolkit has been delivered to over **160 high schools** within Western Australia and received positive feedback from participants and industry partners, reinforcing its value as a practical and empowering guide for both job seekers and employers.
